### The fragile state of peace

Global peace is under threat from authoritarian aggression and expansionism, exemplified by Russia's strategy of subjugation, and from injustices like those in Gaza, calling for strong leadership, adherence to international law, and a unified defense of democracy and human dignity, It requires collective action, beginning at a personal level. ### The new global south

The emergence of the Global South, led by alliances like BRICS, signifies a shift toward a new global order that aims to reflect current geopolitical realities, challenging outdated governance structures.

### China & USA impact on global leadership

China's economic strength and strategic positioning give it the potential to act as a balancing power, yet actions like military exercises with Russia signal competitive ambitions, while shifts in US leadership, depending on the election outcome, could further shape global stability and alliances. A Trump victory is likely to accelerate unpredictability and isolationism. "Dialogue is the biggest power humans possess."
